ESH Comments: Employee was walking from the Transfer Gallery to Wilson Hall when he stepped on the seam between a large asphalt patch and the original asphalt surface in the parking lot east of the Auditorium, resulting in a turned ankle. The entire patch has sunk to varying degrees. The drop-off where this employee turned his ankle is approximately 2 inches. First aid treatment only; no limitations. FESS is arranging for repaving of the area.

Medical Comments: Employee carried box of stainless steel fittings up the stairs; then carried cart up stairs with coworker. Did not hurt until about 1530 hours, when standing was painful. Noticed lumbar pain also this morning.									
ESH Comments: Incident occurred at New Muon Lab. Approximately 30 minutes before the onset of back pain, the employee had carried the box of parts (approx. 25 lbs) and cart (with co-worker) up the three flights of stairs from the lower level to ground level. (No elevator in building.) Prescription medication makes the case recordable. Medical limitations do not prevent the employee from performing all of his routine job functions.									

ORPS/Incidents/Notices of Violation:

Electrical incident at NEB – During a recent DOE walkthrough at NEB, a ballast malfunctioned causing a pop sound and flash. The initial investigation showed that a wire shorted out on an 8 ft. fluorescent lighting fixture causing the ballast to malfunction. The cause of the short is not completely clear, pinched wire during re-ballast/re-lamp or old age and wear in the wire insulation are both possible. The NEB building is now isolated from power and the doors have been marked "Do Not Enter."

H1N1 Update:

- 69 suspected cases have been reported thus far (31 in the last week).
