Medical Comments: While exiting personal vehicle, employee slipped on icy pavement and fell, striking right shin (minor abrasion), left shoulder and posterior.

ESH Comments: The employee was exiting his vehicle upon arriving at work at 8:30 in the morning. As the employee placed his left foot on the pavement and put weight on it, it slipped on an icy patch of pavement. The employee had his right hand on the steering wheel, and his right foot still in the vehicle. As the employee's foot slipped, he fell out of his vehicle landing on his left shoulder, and his right leg came up and struck the underside of the vehicle's driver-side door. The employee came into his office and reported what had happened, and then went to Medical as a precaution. The employee suffered only an abrasion on his right shin, thus this is a first aid only case. Upon investigation, it was noted that the parking lot was clear of ice except where vehicles normally park. Arrangements were therefore made with Roads & Grounds to salt this area before the arrival of employees the following morning.

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Medical Comments: Employee was putting sheets of foam away, and scraped right forearm on a piece of aluminum sheet metal. 9 sutures were taken.

ESH Comments: Employee was cleaning up an area and storing some foam pieces. He was placing them on a lower shelf of a rack. He was sliding the foam over a piece of 1/16 stainless steel that was on the bottom of the rack. As he was stacking the foam, he slid his arm across the stainless steel resulting in a large c-shaped cut on his forearm requiring nine stitches. He was cut by the long side of the SS, not the corner. Recordable injury, not DART.
