Medical Comments: Employee was walking from Cross Gallery to Wilson Hall for lunch. (Construction was underway in area, with traffic cones and barricade tapes.) Some of the barricade tapes came loose from a cone, and were unraveled by the wind. The loose tapes wrapped around the ankles of the employee, causing a fall to the pavement, and injuring left wrist and elbow. Employee was sent to an off-site clinic for evaluation; diagnosed as radial head (elbow joint) fracture; prescription was given.

ESH Comments: The employee was walking in the horseshoe driveway between Linac and the auditorium, outside the barricades surrounding a construction area. The sidewalk along the inside of the horseshoe was inaccessible due to the construction activity which was occurring immediately adjacent to the sidewalk. The employee stated that loose barricade tape had blown away from him (toward the auditorium) as he started walking along the driveway, but the wind blew the tape back toward him as he proceeded north in the driveway. He did not realize the tape had wrapped around his ankles until he fell. The employee received medical limitations, but these do not prevent him from performing all of his routine job functions, so case is not DART. ORPS report required due to bone fracture.
