ESH Comments: Employee was moving files from a storage box that was on his desk chair to his desk surface. He had positioned himself between the box and desk. He picked up a hand full of files from the storage box turned and placed them on the desk. When he turned back to the box he felt sudden pain in his back lower back. Employee was reminded to pivot feet and avoid twisting and lifting at the same time. No limitations were given. **First aid only.**

Medical Comments: While cleaning a sheet metal part, cut fingers on edge when wiping clean and dry. Was wearing nitrile gloves

ESH Comments: The contract technician was working at NWA when the incident occurred. He was in the process of drying stainless steel parts which had just been removed from an ultrasonic cleaning tank. To keep the parts clean when drying the parts, he was wearing thin nitrile gloves. The parts are thin (0.0150") and, as he was wiping a cloth along the edge of one piece, the metal cut through the cloth and the nitrile gloves, resulting in small lacerations on the thumb and forefinger of his right hand. He reported to the Fire Dept. immediately after the injury occurred, since the Medical Office was closed for the day, and then followed up with the Medical Office

the next morning. He received **first aid treatment** and returned to work with no limitations. Replacement gloves which will provide both cut protection and cleanliness are being evaluated; compressed nitrogen will be used in place of wiping cloths for the drying of the edges of the thin parts.
