



Medical Comments: As entering the crossover at CDF trailers and had ben outside (bright day) employee was wearing sunglasses and started up poorly lit hallway. His right foot caught on a cabinet that was not normally in hall and fell forward hitting his right cheek on another cabinet. Area cleaned and dressed.

ESH Comments: The employee was entering the CDF trailers by the west side crossover. As he entered the building and started walking south down the hallway he still had his sunglasses on making it difficult to see. Approximately 10ft from the door he caught his foot and part of his leg on a cabinet causing him to fall forward and hit his face on another cabinet next to it causing a laceration. The area was cleaned and dressed. First aid only.

Medical Comments: Was grinding on a welding test, while wearing safety glasses and a face shield, grinding debris (metal fragment) flew up under PPE equipment and got lodged in right eye. Flushed the eye. Sent to Oak Lawn Care for evaluation and treatment. Was given an Rx and sent to ophthalmologist.

ESH Comments: The employee was performing an arc weld 6-G test for certification, and was grinding on the weld with a small air-powered grinder (Monday). During the grinding step, he had to crouch down slightly and turn his head up to see underneath the test sample to perform the grinding. As part of the certification test procedure, the piece cannot be moved once it is placed in position. The employee could feel small particles come under the face shield that he was wearing, and hit his chin and cheek. He quickly turned away but could feel something in his eye. The employee was wearing safety glasses that had some curvature with his face and a face shield. The employee rinsed his eye in the local eye wash station and then went to Medical. The employee could not visit the recommended local clinic because he car pooled (this was near the end of the work shift), so he was instructed to seek additional medical attention near his home. The employee visited an urgent care facility, and was instructed to see an ophthalmologist, which he did the next day (Tuesday). The ophthalmologist removed a small piece of metal imbedded in the white part of the employee's right eye, and instructed the employee to return the following day (Wednesday) for follow-up. The employee returned to work on Thursday with no work restrictions.

Medical Comments: While securing MT6, section 2 the employee bumped his head on the light fixture atop the stairs. 1/2" abrasion. Area cleaned and dressed.

ESH Comments: The employee was part of the MCR crew doing the search and secure of MT6,

Section 2. Part of his assignment was to stand on a shield block platform and inspect the gap behind the blocks. To do so, he needed to bend at the waist to look into the gap. As he was bending over, his forehead struck the upper corner of a fluorescent light fixture mounted vertically next to the platform, resulting in a small abrasion. He reported to the Medical Office where he received first aid treatment and returned to work with no limitations.
