


<p>Medical Comments: While working on the grounds the employee was stung by a bee on his right ear. Fire Department did first aid. Employee refused transport to hospital.</p>

<p>Medical Comments: The employee was carrying a SCBA bottles from engine to fill station. He placed one bottle on the shelf near the fill station and while getting ready to set a second on the shelf it hit the third bottle causing the employee to get his finger crushed between the bottles. It caused bruising and 3/4" laceration on his little finger left hand. Cleaned and bandaged wound at fire station. Was reported to medical on 9/16/14 and advised to follow up with medical when returns for next shift.</p>									
<p>ESH Comments: Employee was transferring SCBA (Self Contained Breathing Apparatus) cylinders from a fire engine to a storage area. He placed one cylinder under his left arm and carried two more in each hand. After arriving at the storage area, he placed the cylinder in his right hand on the storage rack. He then used his right hand to grasp the top portion of the cylinder under his left arm and began to lower it. It came down faster than he expected, and the lower part of the cylinder struck his left little finger which was at the outer portion of the valve neck of the cylinder in his left hand. The finger suffered the injury described in the Medical Comments section of this report. The employee was not wearing gloves at the time of the accident. The Senior Safety Officer advised the employee to carry only two cylinders at a time.</p>

<p>Medical Comments: On 9/16/14 employee was stung by a yellow jacket on his left hand. He went home for the evening and applied Benadryl cream. On 9/17/14, employee came to medical with swelling, itchy, redness and mild pain. Given additional OTC medication and ice packs. Return to FMO 9/18/14 for re-evaluation.</p>									
<p>ESH Comments: Employee was walking in the lab 3 tech area when he felt a sting and saw a yellow jacket flying away. The yellow jacket stung his left hand, some swelling was present. The incident occurred late in the day on 9/16, supervisor encourage employee to see medical first thing, 9/17. Employee noted that there were no indications of attractants for the yellow jacket in the area (i.e. food, soda, etc.). First aid only.</p>

<p>Medical Comments: Employee was responding to an unrelated alarm in A0 when he observed an odor coming from overheating batteries on the forklift. Employee inhaled the fumes causing</p>									

excessive coughing. Evacuated immediately. Employee evaluated by Fermi Fire Department and Batavia Fire Department. Refused transport to hospital. Came to FMO 9/22/14, for follow up visit and then discharged.

Had x-rays taken and was given a rigid splint and a prescription. Reported to medical 9/22/14.
