Medical Comments: While standing outside manhole, employee was stung on left hand by wasp.

ESH Comments: The employee and co-worker were preparing to enter the PW3 Manhole for an inspection. The employee found two wasp nests attached to the lip of the manhole access hatch and sprayed them with wasp spray. After spraying and after the wasps had appeared to have been subdued, the employee reached down to pick up a sign that had fallen to the ground beside the hatch. As he reached down, a wasp flew out from underneath the lip of the hatch and stung the employee on the left hand. The employee reported to the Medical Office where he received first aid treatment and returned to work with no limitations.

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Medical Comments: Employee was riding bicycle (from Industrial Center Building to Village dorm), and had a head-on collision with another bicyclist. The collision resulted in various head contusions and abrasions. Employee was later transported to Delnor Hospital.

ESH Comments: At about 9:00 PM the individual, a graduate student, was riding a bicycle on loan from TD on the bike path to his dorm in the Village after leaving his office in the Industrial Center Building. The student states that at a location on the path where there is a slight curve and hill, he collided head on with a bicyclist riding in the opposite direction. The student fell to the pavement, hitting his head. The student walked his bicycle back to his dorm room, and then he went to a friend's dorm room. At about 11:30 PM the student called the emergency number because his nose would not stop bleeding. The student was transported to Delnor where he received an x-ray. The student was driven back to his dorm about 4:00 AM. The student has been seen by Medical, who

made a doctor's appointment for the student, but which was not kept by the student. At the time of the incident, the student was wearing a helmet (which shows signs of the impact), but there were no lights on either of the bicycles involved. As a result, TD is in the process of adding LED head and tail lights to all of its bicycles. ORPS/Incidents/Notices of Violation:

reported to medical and returned to work with no restrictions.

- Following a routine annual inspection by the Illinois EPA, DOE/Fermilab is expected to receive a Notice of Violation from IEPA for the unpermitted storage of a mixed waste containing chromium at the Hazardous Waste Storage Facility (HWSF). The lab was storing approximately 5 gallons of a spent mineral rescaling agent (Rydlyme) that contains approximately 9.5 mg/l chromium. Fermilab is not permitted to store waste containing chromium greater than 5 mg/l at the HWSF. The lab has initiated the process of disposing the waste as a mixed waste. This incident will also be categorized as an ORPS once the NOV is written.
- The bicycle accident described above will not be an ORPS, however, it highlights several issues and a lessons learned document is forthcoming from TD.
