**Medical Comments:** While pushing a spool of wire, subcontractor's right foot/heel dropped into a grove (along a track), causing a pulled calf muscle. Treated at an off-site clinic, where a prescription was given for an anti-inflammatory medication.

**ESH Comments:** The contract technician was working with lab employees to move 3 ft diameter reels of heliax cable into the north end of PC4 for storage. PC4 has a pair of rails embedded in the floor running the length of the enclosure, with a groove along one side of each of the rails. While rolling one of the reels, the contract technician stepped on one of the grooves and the heel of his right boot became wedged in the groove. Because the boot was caught in the groove, when he attempted to take the next step his right calf muscle was strained since his right foot could not raise up. *Although prescription medication and limitations were given, this case does not meet the criteria for recordability since the individual's contracting company has less than 10 personnel working on site.*

#### H1N1 Update:


- 158 suspected cases have been reported thus far (6 in the last week again).
