Medical Comments: The employee was cleaning the inside of a corrugated metal pipe, when he cut his 3rd finger on a sharp edge inside the hose. No gloves were worn.

ESH Comments: The employee was cleaning the cuff of a 3" corrugated stainless steel pipe that he was preparing for leak checking. There were several of these pipes that had been on a shelf for some time and were dusty, thus they needed to be cleaned before they could be leak checked. The employee, an experienced leak checker, stated that it had been at least two years since he had leak checked this type of pipe. He cleaned and checked one pipe without incident. He then was preparing the second pipe for leak checking by cleaning the cuffs with a mild cleaner so that a good fit could be achieved with a big rubber stopper. He cleaned the first cuff without incident, but when cleaning the second cuff, the tip of this finger came into contact with a ragged edge where the corrugated tube butted up against the end ring. The employee was using Kim wipes with the mild cleaner. He was not wearing his leather gloves because he was concerned that they would become soaked with the cleaner. (Note: Wearing chemically-impregnated gloves can produce dermatitis.) The employee did not "Take 5" to determine what hazard may exist as he should have given the time lapse since his last leak check of this type of pipe.
